Wendland Named 2020 VATFACS Outstanding Teacher of the Year

Bedford, VA – August 13, 2020 – The Virginia Association for Teachers of Family & Consumer Sciences (VATFACS) honored its award and scholarship recipients during a virtual ceremony on June 29, 2020. Elizabeth Wendland, an instructor at the Susie G. Gibson Science and Technology Center with Bedford County Public Schools, received the 2020 VATFACS Outstanding Teacher of the Year Award. The purpose of the Outstanding Teacher of the Year Award is to recognize teachers who are providing outstanding educational programs for youth and/or adults in Family and Consumer Sciences (FACS) and communities. The award winner must currently be employed as a full-time classroom teacher, be a member of VATFACS, and should demonstrate active involvement with Career and Technical Student Organizations.



Wendland’s passion is teaching technical life skills to her students so they will be lifelong learnings. Her Early Childhood Careers and Teachers for Tomorrow students excel and earn credentials in Praxis and ParaProfessional Certifications. Many of her students are now teachers in Bedford County and other parts of the United States. Wendland has taken her students across the country multiple times for Educators Rising events and been very successful in having students place in the top two in the state and the top ten at the national level. Her internship-based classroom is spread throughout the community to help assist families looking for quality preschool and afterschool programs. Wendland serves on the Child are Desert Committee to help the community find a solution to this issue. The opportunity for leadership is great in Mrs. Wendland’s classroom as the community is in need of child-care workers and teachers to rise on the occasion and help fill the gap of the problematic child care desert along with teacher shortages.

Teeghan Guess, a former student, had this to say about Mrs. Wendland, “One of my favorite memories of her is when she told me good morning every morning I walked into class and she would always ask me how my day was going or how the previous day was. With everything that has been happening, regardless of us not having school anymore, she still checks on me periodically to make sure that I am okay and I’m still looked after and if that doesn’t make her a good teacher, I don’t know what would. For me she is more than an educator, she is a friend, mentor, someone I look up to and aspire to be like one day and I will never forget the impact she has had not only on my education, but my life as well.”
